

Data protection information on the collection of personal data pursuant to Art. 13 and 14 GDPR from customers/suppliers

The following information provides you with an overview of how we process your personal data and your rights under data protection law. Which data is processed in detail and how it is used depends largely on the services requested or agreed in each case.

<p>3. purposes and legal basis of the processing</p>	<p>The processing of personal data (Art. 4 No. 2 GDPR) is carried out for the initiation of a business relationship, the fulfilment of our contractual obligations with you and the execution of your orders as well as all activities required with the operation and administration. The legal basis is Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. b GDPR.</p> <p>If you have given us your consent, we will publish your personal data as part of success stories on the website of simple system GmbH & Co. KG website or in various magazines. The legal basis for this is Art. 6 Para. 1 lit. a GDPR.</p> <p>Insofar as you have given your consent for your personal data to be passed on to us, the lawfulness of the processing of this data is based on your consent.</p> <p>Furthermore, we process your personal data to comply with legal obligations, such as tax retention obligations Legal basis is Art. 6 para. 1 p. 1 lit. c GDPR.</p> <p>We also use your personal data to the extent necessary if we or a third party have a legitimate interest in the processing. The legitimate interest is in connection with ensuring IT support and security, as well as centralising and simplifying processes and optimising business processes. The legal basis is Art. 6 para.1 p.1 lit. f GDPR.</p> <p>Your data will not be used for any other purposes, in particular not for profiling.</p>

<p>4. data origin and data categories</p>	<p>We usually receive personal data from you.</p> <p>In addition, we process - insofar as necessary for the provision of our service - personal data that we have permissibly received from our contractual partners (e.g. for the execution of orders, for the fulfilment of contracts, on the basis of consent given by you or on the basis of a legitimate interest). On the other hand, we process personal data that we have permissibly obtained from publicly accessible sources and are allowed to process.</p> <p>The following categories of personal data are processed:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. master data (surname, first name, date of birth) 2. contact details (address, telephone number, e-mail address) 3. professional career and professional qualifications
<p>5. recipients of the personal data</p>	<p>Within simple system GmbH & Co. KG, your data will be sent to those offices that need it to fulfil our contractual and legal obligations. Processors used by us (Art. 28 GDPR) may also receive data for these purposes. These are mainly companies in the area of IT services and legal advice.</p> <p>With regard to the transfer of data to recipients outside simple system GmbH & Co. KG, it should first be noted that according to the General Terms and Conditions agreed between you and us, we are obliged to maintain confidentiality about all customer-related facts and evaluations of which we become aware. We may only pass on information about you if this is required by law, you have given your consent or we are legally obliged to provide information. Under these conditions, recipients of personal data may be, for example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - IT service providers - State institutions in the event of a legal or official obligation - tax advisors - legal advisers - Service providers in the area of customer acquisition.
<p>6. will data be transferred to a non-EU country</p>	<p>Data transfer to non-EU countries (countries outside the European Economic Area - EEA) does not take place.</p>
<p>7. your rights</p>	<p>If the legal requirements are met, you have the following rights according to Art. 15 to 20 of the GDPR:</p> <p>Right of access (Art. 15 GDPR), rectification (Art. 16 GDPR), deletion (Art. 17 GDPR), restriction of processing (Art. 18 GDPR) and data transferability (Art. 20 GDPR). To exercise your rights, please contact the controller.</p> <p>Furthermore, you have the right to object insofar as we base the processing on a legitimate interest on our part. We will then no longer process the personal data in the event of a justified objection.</p>

	<p>If you have consented to the processing by making a corresponding declaration, you can revoke your consent at any time for the future. We will then no longer process your personal data for the purpose collected.</p> <p>Furthermore, you have the right to contact the supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of your personal data is not lawful (Art. 77 GDPR).</p>
8. duration of the storage of personal data	<p>To the extent necessary, we process and store your personal data for the duration of our business relationship, which also includes, for example, the initiation and execution of a contract.</p> <p>In addition, we are subject to various storage and documentation obligations, which result from the German Commercial Code (HGB) and the German Fiscal Code (AO), among others. The retention and documentation periods specified there are up to ten years.</p>
